History

Tamitik Status of Women (TSW) was incorporated in December of 1976.

TSW began as a grass roots organization where women came together to share their lives and support each other.

TSW has since grown and is an active agency that provides programs and services focused on intervention and prevention of violence and poverty issues in our community.

Programs and services: Dunmore Place

Dunmore Place is a 24 hour a day, year round Transition House. It offers safety and shelter for women and their children who are fleeing from, or at risk of abuse, threats or violence.

A children's support worker is available on site as well as non-resident support for women who choose not to stay overnight.

Dunmore Place provides a 24 hour confidential crisis line.

Outreach Worker / Supportive Counsellor

The outreach program provides short-term individual and group support for the women that have experienced abuse or are living in abusive relationships.

The outreach worker also provides community education on the types of abuse and the impact.

Discovering Healthy Relationships

A Children Who Witness Abuse program offering individual and group counselling to youth ages 3 - 18. Program offers a safe environment to talk about feelings and learn new skills such as problem solving, communication and conflict resolution.

Women's Counselling

Stopping the Violence Program provides long-term individual and group counselling for women who have experienced sexual assault, violence or abuse in relationships and / or childhood abuse.
